...experience democracy and peace

We are members of the world's largest youth movement. We provide a lasting contribution to peace through experiencing democracy and international meetings.

...be critical and politically independent

We encourage critical thinking. We also deal with social political challenges by keeping our independence from political parties.

...respect our environment and protect nature

We encourage our young members to be advocates for the protection of nature and the environment.

...experience community, strengthen competences

We offer children and young adults a community where they can develop their strengths and social competences and encourage the comprehensive development of our members. We strengthen their team-capability and moral courage through effective participation of children and young adults.

... be active as a volunteer, use abilities

Our voluntary members help to create the community through their active involvement in a responsible way. They get their motivation from the sense of their social commitment and from the value of personal friendships within the movement. Our adult leaders develop through exchange of experience, through learning within the group, through personal further education and on training seminars. The qualifications and competences they gain can also be used outside the movement.

... require and encourage permanent development

Our programme for children and young adults and the training of voluntary adult leaders are continuously developed on the basis of our fundamental principles. This development is based on an ongoing evaluation, a permanent exchange between our young members and the adult leaders as well as on the contribution of personal experiences from private and professional environment.



Over 38 million Guides and Scouts in more than 200 countries of the world form the largest youth movement of the planet. All the members of the umbrella organisations "World Association of Girl Guides und Girl Scouts (WAGGGS)" and the "World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM)" share the same mission, "to enable young people to develop their fullest potential as responsible citizens of the world".

and more independently as they plan and implement their projects. They also go abroad and join Guides and Scouts from other countries in international meetings where they live and work together peacefully in a multicultural environment.

Ranger (girls) and Rover (boys) focus on a broad variety of projects which they plan and decide on by themselves. They are supposed to develop a critical and open mind to be able to take responsibility and to contribute to their environment. It is also about enjoying fun and adventures together with friends and exploring the world.
